

What is the SAVE Act?

The **SAVE Act** will make important changes to how we register to vote

- Passed in the U.S. House (April 10, 2025)
- Still waiting on a vote in the Senate



Do you value the right to vote? If so, read this.

What the SAVE Act Would Do:

- Requires Proof of Citizenship In Person
- You'd need a **passport** or **birth certificate with your current legal name** to register to vote.
- (Driver's licenses (including REALIDs) and military IDs **don't** count.)

Ends Online & Mail-In Registration: You could only register in person with documents.

Ends Same-Day Registration: No more signing up to vote on Election Day.

Reduces/ends Automatic Registration at the DMV

Increases Voter Roll Cleanups (Voters might be removed without knowing it.)

Who Could Be Affected Most?

- **Women** who changed their name after marriage
- **Seniors** without updated documents
- **Young voters** who register online
- People in **rural** areas far from government offices
- **Busy families** who can't take time off to register

Why It Matters:

Millions of eligible voters could face new barriers.

8 million people registered online in 2022—this bill would stop that.

******Voter fraud is extremely rare—less likely than being struck by lightning.****
